Parent Report	2/16/06	Heath doesn't like being in one spot very much and needs a lot of attention. He has trouble sitting unsupported and when placed on his tummy he usually turns on his back, making it hard for him to attend to toys for any great length of time.
HELP	2/11/06	Skills exhibited on this instrument fell in the one to three month range. Heath cries, coos, grunts as a means of communication. He grasps objects with his hands and explores those objects with his mouth.

ABC Matrix	1/16/06	Heath reaches for toys that are out of reach, but visible. He can discriminate between his favored toys/objects and others.
Observation	1/16/06	Heath can hold small objects in one hand while reaching for another object (while on his stomach). He can sit upright with support. He attends to most faces and voices. He can raise his head to his chest when placed on her stomach.
Parent Report	2/16/06	Heath looks around for his favorite toy and will try and grab it when it is within his reach. He looks to his mother for comfort and support if needed. Heath is a fussy eater, and often they must wake him up to be fed. Heath becomes very upset in noisy situations is difficult to sooth.
HELP	2/16/06	Skills exhibited on this instrument fell in the one to three month range. Heath looks sat visual stimuli when presented, explores through oral senses. He has control of his eye muscles, and lifts his head when he is on his stomach.
